



Echyonurus	<i>venosus</i>	Late March Brown	Spring (fast water)	12 to 20 mm	
Caenis	<i>luctuosa</i>	Angler's Curse Broadwing White Midge	Summer (dawn and morning)	4 to 4,5 mm	
Rhithrogena	<i>semicolorata</i>	Olive Upright	Spring & early summer (fast water)	9 to 12 mm	
Habrophlebia	<i>laeta</i>	Eaton's Dun	Summer (Evening)	6 to 8 mm	
Baetis	<i>fuscatus scambus</i>	Small Dark Olive	June to September	5,5 to 8 mm	
Cloeon	<i>dipterum</i>	Pond Olive Dun	Year round	7 to 10 mm	
Nigrobaetis	<i>niger</i>	Iron Blue Dun Jenny Spinner	Early & late season	5 to 8 mm	
Epeorus	<i>torrentium</i>	Torrent Dun	Spring (fast water)	16 to 20 mm	
Habroleptoides	<i>confusa</i>	Schoenemund's Dun	Spring	8 to 9 mm	
Heptagenia	<i>sulphurea</i>	Little Yellow May Dun	May to October	8 to 12 mm	
Centroptilium	<i>luteolum</i>	Little Sky-Blue Dun	Year round	5 to 8 mm	
Alainites	<i>muticus</i>	Pale Watery Dun	Spring & late season	4,5 to 7 mm	
Paraleptophlebia	<i>Submarginata cincta</i>	Purple Dun Purple Spinner	May & June	9 to 12 mm
