





Dinocras	<i>cephalotes</i>	Large Stonefly	• Greyish brown • Mid-April to August	Large 15 to 24 mm	
Perlodes	<i>microcephala</i>	Large Stonefly	• Brown • April	Large 12 to 22 mm	
Protonemura	<i>intricata</i>	Early Brown	• Dark brown • Early season	Medium 7 to 9 mm
